BIOGRAPHY

Delegate Atoosa Reaser represents the 27th House District, covering Eastern Loudoun County, in the Virginia House of Delegates. Since beginning her public service, she has established herself as a committed advocate for her constituents, earning her appointments to the GO Virginia State Board, the Virginia Men and Boys Advisory Commission, the Committee on District Courts, and the Joint Commission on Health Care, as well as serving as a proud member of the AAPI Caucus. Delegate Reaser also sits on the committees for Education, Courts of Justice, and General Laws.

Her path to public service is deeply personal. As the first Iranian-American elected to state-level office in Virginia, Delegate Reaser's story begins with her family's decision to flee Iran during a revolution that dismantled freedoms, particularly those of women. Arriving in a country where hard work and education could open doors, she carried that experience with her through every chapter of her career, and it remains the foundation of her work in the legislature today.

Delegate Reaser has called Loudoun County home for more than two decades, and her roots in the community run deep. Long before she took her seat in Richmond, she was serving her neighbors, first on the Loudoun County School Board, where she was elected Vice Chair twice by her colleagues, and through years of volunteer work with the PTA, Scouts, and LINK Against Hunger. Her professional career spans law and education, having worked as a teacher, a prosecutor, in-house counsel, and qualifying as a Virginia Supreme Court guardian ad litem.
