Welcome and Opening Remarks

EMILY O'QUINN | Senior Vice President of Investor Relations and Corporate Communications, Alpha Metallurgical Resources

Emily O'Quinn is Senior Vice President of Investor Relations and Corporate Communications for Alpha Metallurgical Resources (NYSE: AMR), the largest U.S. producer of metallurgical coal for the steel industry. In her role, Emily leads the company's public affairs efforts with responsibility for investor relations, government relations, communications, and corporate affairs. With experience in both private and public companies, Emily has communications experience in a variety of business transactions including mergers, divestitures, an initial public offering, a Chapter 11 bankruptcy restructuring, and the launch of a new company. Over the course of her career, Emily also has been responsible for crisis management, strategic messaging and advocacy campaigns, corporate philanthropy, media relations, annual reporting, and management of political action committees. In addition to her corporate background, Emily is engaged in the community and volunteers her time with organizations to help expand educational opportunities for children and increase access to the arts. She is currently President of the Board of Trustees for Barter Theatre, the State Theatre of Virginia. Emily has served on a number of regional and local non-profit boards of directors, and she is a past gubernatorial appointee to both the Library of Virginia Board and the Southwest Virginia Cultural Heritage Foundation Board of Trustees. She currently serves in a gubernatorial appointment to the Growth and Opportunity (GO Virginia) state board, which focuses on the Commonwealth's economic development priorities to ensure a strong Virginia. Emily holds a Bachelor's degree in English from King College in Tennessee. She is also a graduate of the Women in Governance Executive Education program through UCLA's Anderson School of Management.

CARRIE H. CHENERY | Secretary of Commerce and Trade

Carrie H. Chenery is a native Virginian with two decades of experience in economic development, public policy, government relations, and strategic communications through both public service and private business. Her career spans identifying business growth opportunities for clients, leading a regional economic development organization, managing economic development policy for Virginia's largest private industries, and shepherding legislative and budgetary priorities through the Virginia General Assembly. Prior to her appointment as Secretary of Commerce & Trade, Chenery founded and led Valley Pike Partners, helping companies grow across Virginia with modern strategies in public affairs, business development, and community engagement. Carrie previously served as the Executive



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Director of the Shenandoah Valley Partnership (SVP), the region's economic development and marketing organization. During her tenure, the region announced new and existing business projects representing over \$460 million in capital investment and 1,900 new jobs while unifying seven counties and five cities under a shared economic development vision, building coalitions among 160 private sector investors, and serving as the region's strategic voice to site consultants, partner agencies, and elected and appointed officials. Prior to her leadership role at SVP, Carrie served the Virginia Office of the Governor as the Assistant Secretary of Agriculture & Forestry. She was responsible for the oversight and advancement of economic development efforts, including administration of the Governor's Agriculture and Forestry Industries Development (AFID) fund, related to Virginia's largest private industries of agriculture and forestry. During her tenure, the AFID fund contributed to the announcement of over \$46 million in new private capital investment and the creation of over 400 jobs. Prior to her role in the Governor's Office, she gained wide-ranging economic development, marketing, government relations, and communication experience across diverse industry sectors as the Manager of Legislation & Policy at the Virginia Economic Development Partnership and as a Director of Government Affairs with the law firm Williams Mullen. A graduate of Virginia Tech, Carrie earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Environmental Policy & Planning and Agricultural & Applied Economics. She is also a graduate of the Political Leaders Program through the Sorensen Institute for Political Leadership at the University of Virginia. She previously served as a gubernatorial appointee to the Virginia Economic Development Partnership Authority Board of Directors and the Virginia Tech Board of Visitors. Carrie has been named one of North America's Top 50 Economic Developers by Consultant Connect and as an Outstanding Alumni by the Virginia Tech College of Agriculture and Life Sciences. She and her husband, Taylor, are the proud parents of two daughters.

DR. BILL FIEGE | President, Brightpoint Community College

Dr. Bill Fiege became Brightpoint Community College's eighth president in January 2024. For nearly 12 years prior, Dr. Fiege oversaw operations for academic and student affairs as vice president of learning and student success at the college. Before joining Brightpoint, Dr. Fiege held positions at Germanna Community College and Longwood University, serving in a variety of roles including division dean, speech communication faculty member, assistant director of alumni relations, and assistant director of athletics. He completed his bachelor's degree in political science at Longwood University; master's degree in speech communication from Bloomsburg University; and Ph.D. in community college leadership through Old Dominion University. Dr. Fiege is currently a member of Virginia's Gateway Region Board of Directors, YMCA of Greater Richmond Board of Directors, and MEGA Mentors Board of Directors. He also coaches the Ironbridge National travel softball team. He and his wife, Renee have two daughters. They live in Midlothian, Virginia.

JOSEPH PARILLA | Senior Fellow and Director of Applied Research, Brookings Metro

Joe Parilla is a senior fellow and Director of Applied Research at Brookings Metro, where he is recognized as a leading expert in inclusive economic growth. Since joining Brookings in 2012, he has played a key role in shaping research and policy initiatives that support equitable economic development in cities and regions across the United States. His work has influenced both local and national place-based economic policies, as well as multi-sector investment strategies that promote shared prosperity in several cities and regions. Parilla's research has been widely cited and has helped redefine best practices in economic development, talent development, innovation, and regional competitiveness. As Director of Applied Research, Parilla has designed and led major projects that connect research with real-world impact. Most recently, he has led the research portfolio for the Regional Inclusive Growth Network, a coalition of civic leadership organizations focused on advancing racially inclusive economic growth. Since 2022, he has spearheaded applied research projects examining the implementation of place-based industrial programs funded through the American Rescue Plan Act and the CHIPS and Science Act. To translate these insights into action, he supports a network of innovation and economic development leaders in seven U.S. regions as they leverage significant public investments in strategic sectors to expand economic opportunities for residents and communities. He is also deeply engaged in bridging local action with state and federal economic policy, and regularly advises policymakers in states across the nation, key federal agencies, and the White House. He holds a B.A. in economics and geography from Macalester College and an M.P.P. from Georgetown University. He lives in Washington, D.C., with his family.

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SARA DUNNIGAN | Deputy Director, DHCD

Sara Dunnigan is the Deputy Director of the Economic Development and Community Vitality (EDCV) division within the Virginia Department for Housing and Community Development. She serves as lead staff for GO Virginia, an economic development initiative driving the growth and diversification of regional economies across the Commonwealth. GO Virginia has supported 263 projects and made more than \$110.0 million in investments designed to support growth within targeted industry clusters and create new, higher paying jobs. Other units within the division include Virginia Main Street, Microfinance, and Real Estate Revitalization, which includes Virginia's Enterprise Zone Program. Sara has more than 25 years of experience in business recruitment, business retention and expansion, workforce development, and strategic place marketing. She earned a degree in Economics from Wright State University. Sara served in former Governor Ralph Northam's workforce secretariat and as former Governor Terry McAuliffe's Chief Workforce Policy Advisor and Executive Director of the Virginia Board of Workforce Development. Prior to joining state government, Sara worked at the Greater Richmond Partnership.
