Virginia Residential Code (Building)

RB44 - Removes 13R reference

Proponent(s): Jeffrey Shapiro (<u>jeff.shapiro@intlcodeconsultants.com</u>) - Consultant, National Fire Sprinkler Associates

Comments:

- Mr. Beahm (representing himself) says that if the current code doesn't conflict with anything in the state amendments, he would prefer to leave it in. He would "typically be opposed" to this change.
- Mr. Milliken (Stafford County Fire) and Mr. Brown of DHCD mention a reference in R310.1 that is reflected at the state level in the VCC that is used.
- Mr. Shapiro agrees with the above comments and withdraws.

RB200 Substantial damage and substantial improvement definitions

Proponent(s): Resiliency Subworkgroup (explained by Mr. Brown of DHCD) **Comments:**

- Mr. Payne (AIA Virginia) brings up the difference in definitions between the IEBC and the VEBC; Mr. Brown clarifies that this proposal should match the VEBC definition
- Ms. Quinn of FEMA claims that national code language is based on FEMA requirements, so she wants to clarify whether this proposal should match the IEBC requirements.

- Mr. Shapiro agrees to add 13 and 13R.

- Mr. Brown (DHCD) adds the language "and shall comply with the following:"

- Mr. Holland (NEMA) claims we are missing the ability to more comprehensively protect people in preventing fires, and that this proposal fixes some of the discrepancies. He is in support.
- Mr. Clark of the Homebuilders' Association talks about incremental adoption of the GFCI technologies, as opposed to the full adoption this proposal outlines. He is in support of RTE3902.16(2) instead.
- Mr. Smith of Eaton supports this proposal.
- Mr. Farrell (VBCOA) is in full support of this proposal and RTE3902.16(2).

Virginia Residential Code (Plumbing)

RTP608.15 - Backflow Preventers

Proponent(s): Richard Grace, VPMIA (<u>richard.grace@fairfaxcounty.gov</u>) Comments:

- Mr. Clark of the Homebuilders' Association of Virginia brings up an issue with the language potentially not including "manufacturers' instructions"
- Mr. Beahm (representing himself) suggests modification to ensure no conflicts between manufacturers and the code itself. Also, had issues with "ready access" language.
- Mr. Beahm and Mr. Grace have a discussion regarding changing the "or" in this clause to "and," and whether the manufacturers' specifications are going to apply, or the residential codes, and which would take precedence.

• DHCD staff brings up the fact that the most restrictive code shall apply.

Comments: No opposition **Results:** Consensus for Approval

Virginia Residential Code (Energy)

RE404.2 - Electric Readiness

Proponent(s): William Penniman (<u>wpenniman@aol.com</u>), Sierra Club Comments:

- Mr. Holland (NEMA) speaks strongly in support of this proposal.
- Ms. Main, representing herself, is strongly in support.
- Mr. Banashek representing himself is strongly in support.
- Mr. Kines (Prince William County) agrees with the principle; however, he has some concerns with the specificity of language regarding electrical requirements.
- Mr. Statzer of VBCOA agrees with Mr. Kines: support in theory, opposes in practice.
- Mr. Holland acknowledges that modifications will still need to be made, but he still underscores the importance of this proposed change. He notes that this was what was put forward for the 2021 codes, and it would be better for this proposal to reflect more comprehensively what was eventually decided for the 2021 codes.
- Mr. Goplerud (Faith Alliance for Climate Solutions) supports.
- Ms. Eggerton (Alexandria) is in strong support on the grounds that this will help localities come up with environmental action plans.
- Mr. Clark of HBAV opposes on the grounds of cost.
- Mr. Vaughan of Columbia Gas opposes, citing gas still being a very important and affordable piece of the heating and cooling market.
- Ms. Papageorge of Southern Company Gas opposes.

E405.10 - Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

Proponent(s): William Penniman (<u>wpenniman@aol.com</u>), Sierra Club

Comments:

- Mr. Abraham of Virginia Association of Commercial Real Estate is opposed based on language.
- Mr. Holland of NEMA is strongly in support based on efficiency, affordability, and consistency of standards across localities in the state. He notes there is support at the national level as well during the 2021 code adoption process.
- Mr. Banashek representing himself discusses how we could solve many issues with EV charging stations. He is in support.
- Ms. Tamres representing herself speaks out in strong support of this proposal.

- Mr. Gordon of AOBA is opposed on the grounds that the one-size-fits-all solutions don't really apply here. The data don't support this, and this would be more appropriate at the local level.
- Mr. Statzer of VBCOA supports.
- Ms. Eggerton of Alexandria is in support, pointing out that EV charging stations are part of a larger environmental impact plan.
- Ms. Kelley of Southeastern Energy Efficiency Alliance is in full support of this proposal.
- Mr. Clark of VBCOA disagrees with Mr. Penniman on the grounds that if code doesn't
 force developers to include charging stations for single-family homes, then they just
 won't do it. He has seen evidence to the contrary.
- Ms. Loving representing CAAV supports this proposal. As a consumer, she also speaks in support.

E1301.1.1.1 - Deletion of All State Amendments to the Energy Code

Proponent(s): Andrew Grigsby (grigsby.ac@gmail.com)

Comments:

- Mr. Penniman (Sierra Club) is in support.
- Mr. Goplerud (FACS) makes the point that Virginia as a state is behind many other states in terms of energy amendment adoptions. He supports.
- Mr. Shippee (self) fully supports this proposal.
- Mr. Clark of VBCOA opposes.
- Mr. Beahm (Warren County) opposes.
- Mr. Statzer (VBCOA Energy Committee) supports.
- Mr. Shearer representing himself supports.

Results: Non-Consensus

RE402.1.2(6) - Insulation and fenestration criteria

Proponent(s): William Penniman (<u>wpenniman@aol.com</u>), Sierra Club

Comments:

- Mr. Payne (AIA Virginia) suggests that the proposal itself include what would be the end result. There seems to be a vague target with this proposal.
- Mr. Clark of VBCOA opposes.
- Mr. Shearer representing himself agrees with Mr. Payne.
- Mr. Lacey (RECA) is in support of this proposal, and is happy to work together to accomplish these goals as well as those related to his RECA proposals in WG2.
- Ms. Shutler of the Virginia Grassroots Coalition is in support.
- Mr. Gordon (AOBA) supports a carryover, but he is concerned based on the premise of the cost-benefit analysis that consumers or owners would not make the right decision on their own.
- Mr. Penniman wishes to clarify that the first priority is health and safety of residents, and cost-saving measures are helpful, but secondary.

RE402.4.1.2(2) - Air Leakage Rate Testing/Limits

Proponent(s): William Penniman (<u>wpenniman@aol.com</u>), Sierra Club Comments:

- Mr. Shippee (self) is in strong support of this proposal.
- Mr. Payne (AIA Virginia) opposes on principle of there being a compromise to allow 5 air changes/hour.
- Mr. Clark of VBCOA is not in support.
- Mr. Beahm (Warren County) opposes; he believes the language in place is sufficient and does not need to be changed as per this proposal.
- Ms. Stillman representing herself is in support in order to make houses more energyefficient.
- Mr. Lacey (RECA) supports the compromise we achieved with HBAV and others (blower door testing at 5 ACH50. While our original position was 3 ACH50, we believe 5 ACH50 was a fair and productive improvement in the code.

RE403.1.2 - Electric Resistance Heat Restrictions

Proponent(s): William Penniman (<u>wpenniman@aol.com</u>), Sierra Club **Comments:**

- Ms. Eggerton of Alexandria is in support.
- Ms. Stillman representing herself is in support of this proposal.
- Ms. Main representing herself speaks in support as well, that it benefits the buyers.
- Mr. Payne (AIA Virginia) opposes; he believes this language should be in the existing building code.
- Mr. Beahm (Warren County) speaks in opposition.
- Mr. Gordon (AOBA) opposes.

Results: Non-Consensus

RE403.1.4 - Primary Space Heating Systems

Proponent(s): William Penniman (<u>wpenniman@aol.com</u>), Sierra Club

Comments:

- Ms. Stillman (self) is in support.
- Mr. Shippee (self) is in support.
- Mr. Clark (HBAV) is opposed.
- Ms. Whayland of Virginia Natural Gas is opposed on a cost basis.
- Mr. Vaughan of Columbia Gas is opposed on the grounds that heat pumps won't be as effective for all types of homes throughout the state.
- Ms. Eggerton of Alexandria argues against this point; current heat pumps' technology heats from the lowest temperature of 7 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Mr. Payne of AIA Virginia is opposed.
- Ms. Phillips of Washington Gas is also opposed.
- Ms. Papageorge of Southern Company Gas opposes this proposal.
- Ms. Shutler of the Virginia Grassroots Coalition is in support of this proposal.

Results: Non-Consensus.

E404.2 - Solar-Ready Zone (Mandatory)

Proponent(s): William Penniman (<u>wpenniman@aol.com</u>), Sierra Club Comments:

- Ms. Loving (CAAV) is in support; for the building industry, solar can be a very good opportunity.
- Ms. Eggerton of Alexandria supports.
- Mr. Clark of VBCOA opposes and asks about a certain spot on the roof being designated for solar energy Mr. Penniman clarifies that that is the case.
- Mr. Holland of NEMA supports.
- Mr. Statzer mentions that the VBCOA Energy Code Committee, in part, supports this proposal.
- Mr. Payne (AIA Virginia) points out that shaded areas are very subjective; what happens if there is a tree that isn't on your property that blocks the mandatory solar panel? Mr. Payne identifies that there could be a tightening of language.
- Ms. Loving speaks on behalf of self and the Climate Action Alliance of the Valley. CAAV supports this proposal.
- Ms. Main (representing herself) speaks in support of this proposal.
- Mr. Beahm (speaking for himself and Warren County) opposes on the basis of "vague language."

Results: Non-Consensus

RE407.1.1 - Additional Energy Requirements

Proponent(s): William Penniman (<u>wpenniman@aol.com</u>), Sierra Club **Comments:**

- Ms. Shutler of the Virginia Grassroots Coalition supports. She does not think this proposal is too ambitious.
- Mr. Clark with VBCOA is in opposition.
- Mr. Payne (AIA Virginia) is concerned about the subjectivity of the language of this proposal.
- Mr. Lacey (RECA) is in support based on the fact that the proposal is based largely on the 2021 code requirements, and that RECA certainly supports this.
- Ms. Eggerton of Alexandria clarifies that Virginia has used future model code language into code development for deck requirements many years ago and in other cases as well. She is in support.
- Mr. Shearer (representing himself) is also in support.
- Ms. Loving of CAAV is also in support and like Mr. Lacey, believes this change would provide greater options and flexibility; she would welcome further stringency as well.
- Mr. Gordon of AOBA is opposed to the proposal due to the vague language and cost concerns.
- Mr. Farrell of VBCOA is concerned about including "non-mandatory options" in the proposal because they would be difficult to enforce from a maintenance perspective.

ERB101 - Zero energy building standards appendix

Proponent(s): William Penniman (<u>wpenniman@aol.com</u>), Sierra Club **Comments:**

- Ms. Shutler of Virginia Grassroots Coalition is in support, but believes there should be mandatory language for what constitutes as "zero energy."
- Ms. Loving (CAAV) is in support
- Mr. Shearer (representing himself) is in support.
- Mr. Beahm representing himself, opposes on the grounds that this does not need to be brought in until 2021.
- Mr. Payne of AIA Virginia wonders why this is in the appendix and not the BODY of the code.
- Mr. Clark of HBAV is opposed.
- Mr. Lacey of RECA speaks in support, in that it may be helpful for consumers and builders.
- Mr. Clements of Chesterfield County opposes, based on lack of enforceability.
